After learning about the squid's anatomy, the scouts proceeded to a classroom where they had the opportunity to perform their own squid dissections. Following this, the scouts learned about whales by going

inside an inflatable fin whale and then got to recreate a shoreline using KEVA Planks.

Before getting into their sleeping bags, which were scattered throughout the EcoTarium's exhibits, the scouts were treated to a show in the Alden Digital Planetarium. The planetarium program featured the night sky, popular constellations and galaxies beyond

the Milky Way. The next morning began bright and early. Scouts got to choose between participating in brisk walk throughout the grounds where they could learn about the museum's animals and sledding. It was a fun and educational weekend.



Suspects sought in Uxbridge breaking and entering

UXBRIDGE — On Thursday, Feb. 19, in the early evening, the Uxbridge Police Department was notified that a past residential breaking and entering had occurred in the Hazel

Street area of town. Officers Thomas Stockwell, Benjamin Smoot and Steven Clinton were dispatched and initiated an investigation, as the perpetrators spent considerable time removing items from inside the domicile.

Detective Steven Prior was summoned to the scene to assist with the investigation. Police personnel processed the crime scene and collected evidence. Many distinguishable items

were taken from the home to include jewelry, coin collections, silver noted dollar bills and a large assortment of tools and family heirlooms.

Information was provided by a local business owner and additional evidence collected along the roadside by neighbors assisted Uxbridge Police with the investigation and a search warrant was obtained and executed at the suspect's home in Uxbridge on Sunday, Feb. 22. Evidence from the house break was recovered and the suspects were identified.

Arrest warrants have been issued for Ashley White, 27, and Peter Deleo, 34. The warrants are extraditable in all New England states.

Detective Prior, with the assistance of detectives from Worcester, Leominster and Cranston Rhode Island were able to identify and recover additional stolen property from pawnshops and businesses within their respective jurisdictions.
